

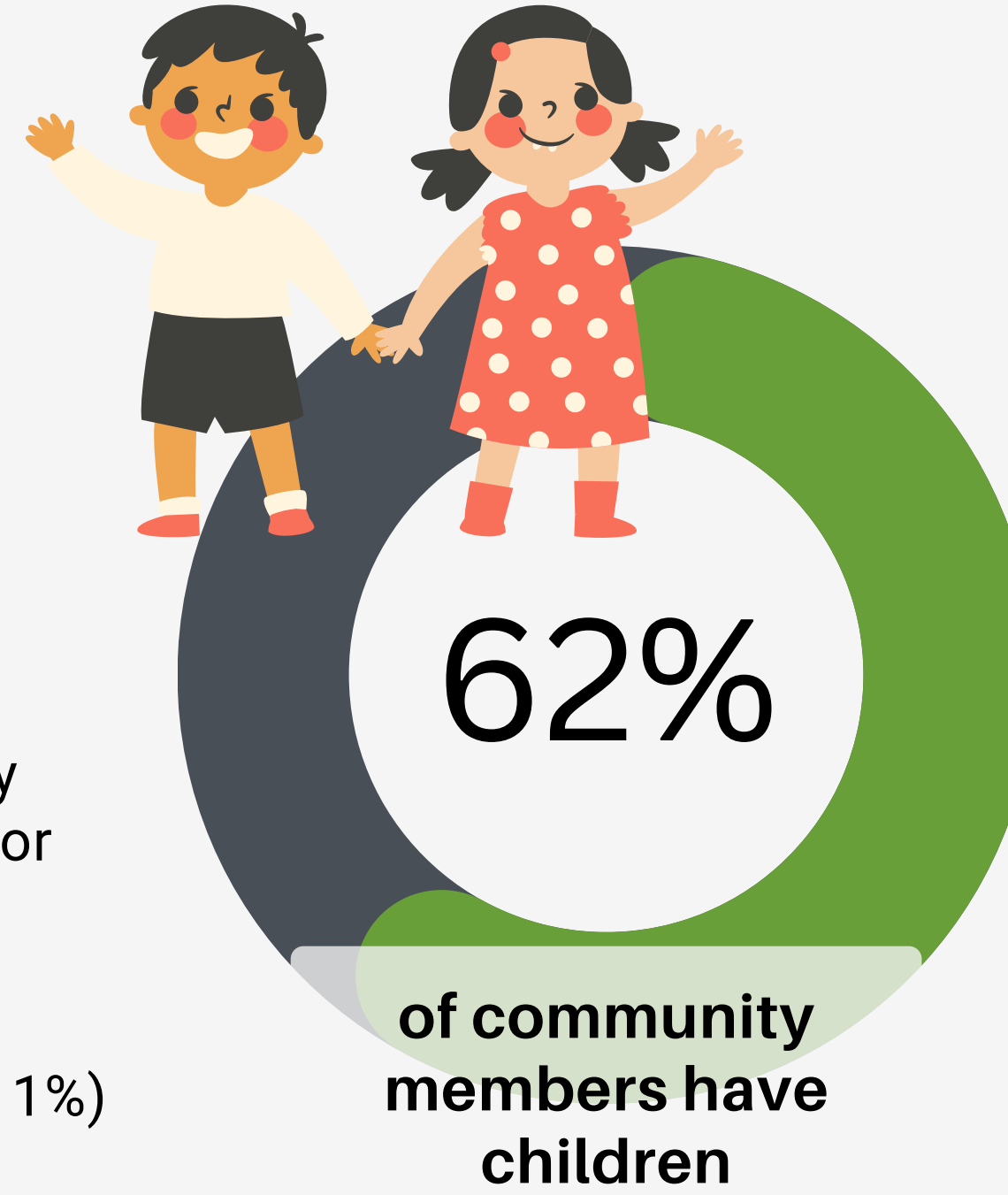
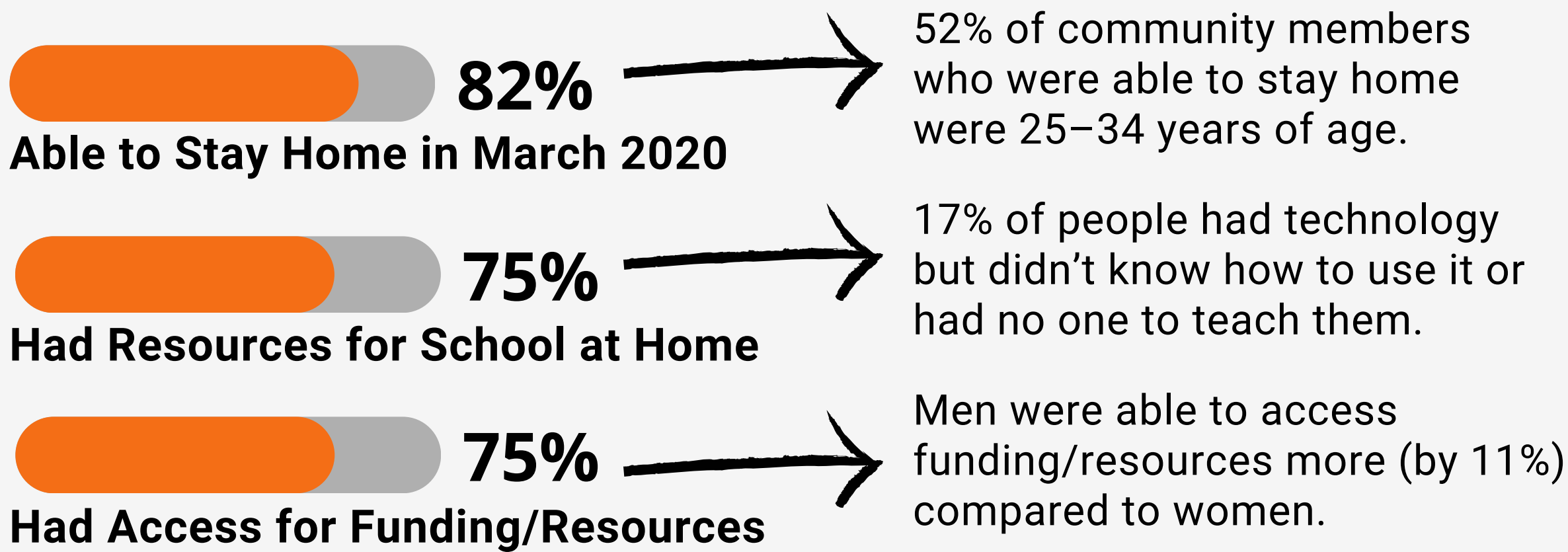

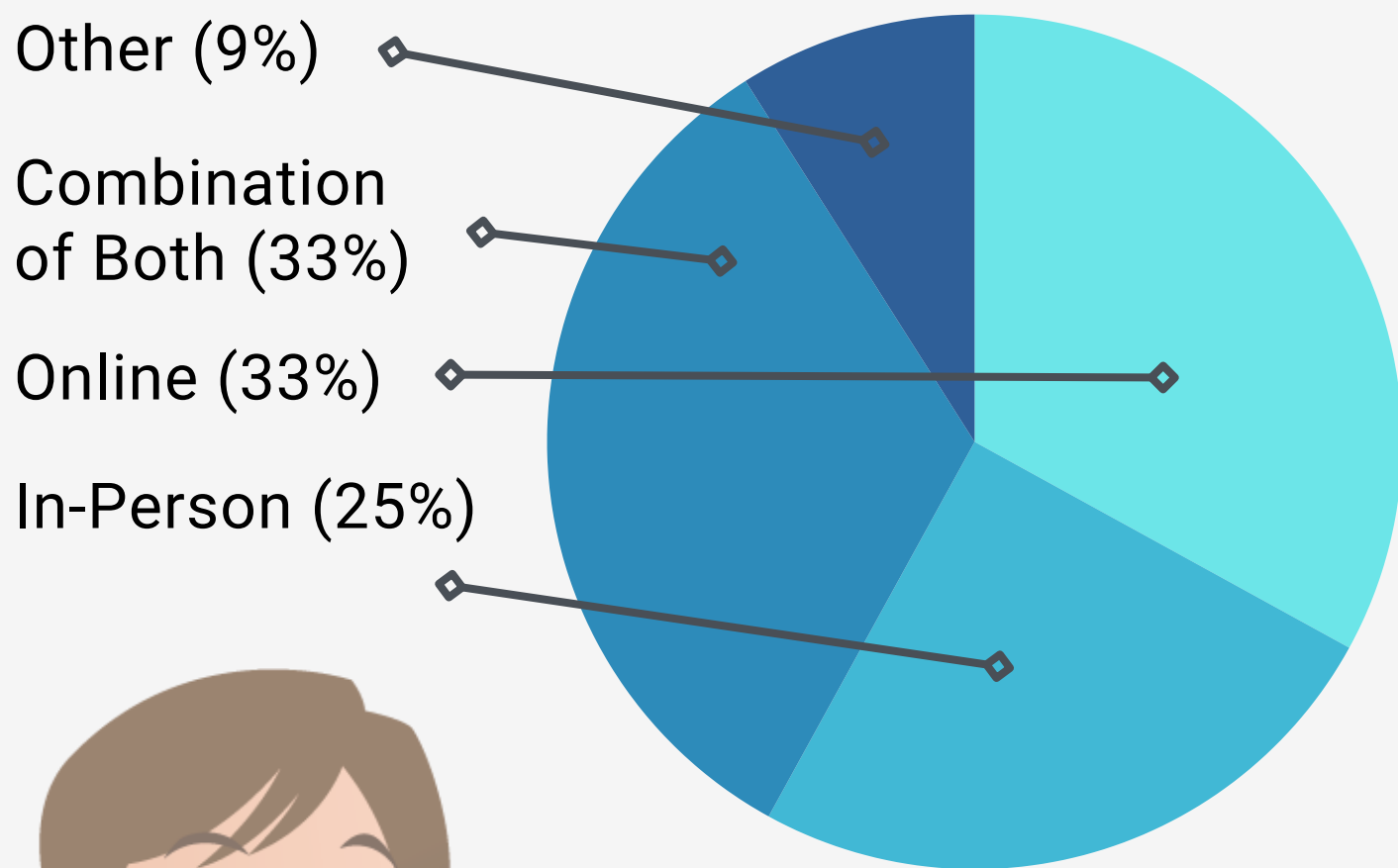
## Section 5: Children and Education

### CONCERNS ABOUT THE WELLBEING OF CHILDREN

Parents had the following concerns about their children (ranging from sometimes to always concerned):

- Overall Wellness (91.8%)
- Social Interaction (90.5%)
- Learning Development (88%)
- Language Skills (86%)
- Child Development (85.2%)
