Ottawa Aboriginal Coalition Hosts the 2025 Career Fair – October 23, 2025

On October 23, 2025, the Ottawa Aboriginal Coalition (OAC) will host the 2025 Career Fair, bringing together 11 Indigenous service organizations alongside 65 additional employers from a wide range of industries. These industries include Indigenous businesses, nonprofits, construction, education, government, healthcare, hospitality, tourism, real estate, and more. Open to both Indigenous and non-Indigenous job seekers, the fair provides a welcoming space to explore new career paths, connect with industry professionals, and discover exciting job opportunities. In addition to job opportunities, the Career Fair will feature:

- An Indigenous Marketplace, showcasing the creativity and entrepreneurship of Indigenous artisans and vendors.
- Keynote speaker Zorga Qaunaq, one of the stars of North of North.
- Free workshops designed to enhance job search and career development skills including Entrepreneurship, Indigenous Employment Programs, Working in the different Trades.
- A Meet-and-Greet with OAC Elders and Knowledge Keepers Circle.

The Career Fair will also feature special displays on key OAC initiatives that will bring new jobs into Ottawa including the new Inuit VAW Shelter to be ready in early 2027.

The event will begin and conclude with ceremonies led by OAC Indigenous Grandmother Irene Compton, who is also the Employment Manager at Minwaashin Lodge.
